# UNITED WAY and FUNDED COMMUNITY PARTNERS

Over 100 years ago, United Way developed a better way to move Greater Lafayette's children, adults, and families from crisis to stability and self-sufficiency.

United Way created a diverse network of human service providers referred to as "funded partners," which today is over 25 agencies strong. In parallel with the old adage: "Give a man a fish, you feed him for a day; teach a man to fish, you feed him for a lifetime," United Way believes in the general principle of alleviating poverty by facilitating self-sufficiency. United Way and its funded partners offer an unparalleled comprehensive mix of programs and services to help with 1) basic needs—to move individuals from crisis to stability and 2) education—to move individuals from stability to self-sufficiency.

United Way meets basic needs through its Tippecanoe Housing and Stability Hotline (over 2,000 calls annually) and its Volunteer Income Tax Assistance program (an annual impact in Greater Lafayette of over \$2 million). United Way supports education through its Read to Succeed program, Kindergarten Countdown Camp, Poverty Simulation, Volunteer Engagement Center, and Peer Union Counseling.



### JOIN THE VANGUARD LEADERSHIP GIVING PROGRAM:

The Vanguard Leadership Giving Program is a tradition of support that recognizes donors who contribute \$1,000 or more to United Way of Greater Lafayette.

There are six levels of Vanguard Leadership Giving:

➢ Pearl Level: \$1,000 to \$1,499
 ➢ Topaz: \$1,500 − \$1,999
 ➢ Sapphire: \$2,000 − \$3,499
 ➢ Ruby: \$3,500 to \$4,999
 ➢ Emerald: \$5,000 to \$9,999

The Vanguard Leadership Giving Program began with a grant from Great Lakes Chemical Corporation in 1987, and the first group of Vanguard Donors contributed \$163,400. Although Vanguard donors comprise less than 10% of United Way's individual donor base, this select group of donors account for over 50% of donations received from individuals.
